Bear's Den Park Trail

Bear's Den Park Trail is part of the Appalachian Trail and is a short easy hike with a rocky outcropping that offer outstanding panoramic views of the Northern Shenandoah Valley and the Allegheny Mountains. The rocks are great for scrambling and served as a signal station in the Civil War, you can even see the soldiers graffiti carved into the rocks. This popular hike is 1.6 mile (approximately 45 minute) out-and-back trail is 285 feet in elevation. Beat the crowds by hiking the trail in the evening and catch the sunset to the west. Dogs are welcome on a leash. Take VA-7 East (Harry Byrd Highway) and right onto Rt. 601 (Blue Ridge Mountain Road) in Bluemont, VA with parking lot on the right. Follow the blue-blazed AT side trail at the back of the lot.



Raven's Rock Trail

Raven's Rock Trail is part of the Appalachian Trail nicknamed the "roller coaster" because of its winding trail up and down multiple steep ridges. It is a strenuous 6 mile out-and-back hike with an elevation gain of 1,535 feet and takes an average of 3 1/2 hours to complete. The trail begins at Snickers Gap on top of the Blue Ridge Mountains and climbs through heavily wooded areas with rock crossings and streams. The final summit is a band of cliffs with spectacular views to the west and south of the Shenandoah Valley. Hiking boots and trekking poles are recommended for navigating the very rocky terrain. Not recommended for dogs. Take VA-7 East (Harry Byrd Highway) and left on Rt. 679 (Pine Grove Road) in Bluemont, VA, trailhead parking lot is on the right.

VILLAGE of Millwood



Visit the historic Burwell-Morgan Mill, shop the [Locke Store](#) and get a bite at [The Buttery](#).

Tour the [Burwell-Morgan Mill](#) and see the immense interior water wheel, a [National Register Historical Landmark](#). One of the oldest, most original operational grist mills in the heart of the Shenandoah Valley. In the early 1780's General Daniel Morgan, a true Revolutionary War hero, joined efforts with Col. Nathaniel Burwell of Carter Hall to build a water powered mill. Experience the power of the turning wooden gears, shafts, bins and old millstones while the miller in period clothing explains the process of grinding wheat and corn just as it was done over 200 years ago. Freshly ground flour, corn meal and grits are available for sale. It currently is owned and operated by the Clarke County Historical Association is considered a crown jewel of cultural significance that combines history, art, science, education, and engineering fascinating to every age group.
